Value of Visitor Centres

Making a vital contribution to our economy

Western Australia's network of Visitor Centres play a central role in servicing the visitors to our State.

But more than this, recent research has shown the valuable contribution Visitor Centres make to our economy and the creation of local jobs.

Research commissioned by Tourism Research Australia and Tourism Australia, and carried out by Metrix Consulting, reveals Visitor Centres provide unrivalled information to visitors, encouraging them to do more and stay longer. This means visitors spend more and create more jobs in the region they visit.

The main findings of the research* are:

- Nearly all (95%) Visitor Centre users believe the Centre is an important part of their overall visitor experience;
- A majority of Visitor Centre users (87%) know more about the things to see and do in the location;
- Most users (84%) indicate the Visitor Centre had a positive influence on how they view the location;
- Most users heard about and decided to participate in activities as a result of visiting a centre. Of users, 74% found out about an activity from the centre, while 70% organised to participate in an activity as a result of their visit the centre.
